## Can I travel to other hospitals in Europe?

## What is the EU Digital COVID Certificate?

An EU Digital COVID Certificate is a digital **proof** that a person has either:

- been **vaccinated** against COVID-19,
- received a **negative** test result or
- **recovered** from COVID-19

The EU Digital COVID Certificate will facilitate safe free movement of citizens in the EU during the COVID-19 pandemic. The certificate will be introduced in EU Member States. Countries can start issuing and using it already and it will become available in all EU Member States as of 1 July 2021.

## How will citizens get the certificate?

National authorities are in charge of issuing the certificate. It could, for example, be issued by test centres or health authorities, or directly via an eHealth portal. Please contact your national authority for more information.

## When will the EU Digital COVID Certificates be accepted?

On the 1<sup>st</sup> of July 2021, **ALL** Member States will accept the EU Digital COVID Certificate. **Some** Member States already accept them **now**.

## Will all certificates of vaccines and tests be accepted by all Member States?

The **EMA approved vaccines**, all **PCR tests**, and **83 Rapid Antigen Tests** performed as agreed by the Member States will be accepted by **ALL** Member States **from the 1<sup>st</sup> of July**. Member States may also decide to accept certificates for other vaccines, such as those on the WHO Emergency Use List.
